Dear Supporters,



BOS UK 2023 impact

Support for BOS Foundation

BOS UK continues its support throughout 2023 of BOS Foundation's industry leading work for ape conservation. Our BOS UK donors directly support the BOS Foundation rehabilitation centre operations to ensure the highest level of care for our orangutans and sun bears.

£118,668.03 TOTAL FOR BOS FOUNDATION

BOS UK transferred £118,668.03 to BOS Foundation in 2023, all thanks to our myriad of amazing supporters. **Included in this we transferred:**

£50,000 TO GIVE UNRELEASABLES A BETTER LIFE

By raising £18,000 in public fundraising and £7000 in grants which was then matched and doubled for Sanctuary Island campaign funds to assist BOS Foundation in building safe islands covered in natural vegetation for unreleasable orangutans to live.

BUILDING SECONDARY FOREST IN SAMBOJA LESTARI

This project continues the work to ensure the existence of ecologically sound and secure forests.

REFORESTATION OF MAWAS


The Mawas Conservation Area in Central Kalimantan concentrates on preserving the existing population of wild orangutans living in a vast peat swamp forest. Reforestation activities include land and planting preparation.

ORANGUTAN FREEDOM

After a very challenging couple of years, BOS Foundation has started the release program again, moving rehabilitated orangutans to either Sanctuary Islands, Pre-release Islands, or out to protected forests. With many releases planned, help is needed to meet our big release goals.

BORN2BEWILD IN COLLABORATION WITH BOS SCHWEIZ AND BOS AUSTRALIA

This is to prepare orangutans for their release into the wild, provide lifelong care of orangutans that we cannot release into the wild and the construction of pre-release and sanctuary islands for orangutans.



BOS UK, along with its global partner offices, provided support for BOS Foundation's work that included:

- Care for and rehabilitation of 359 orangutans and 73 sun bears
- Rescue of 4 orangutans
- 22 orangutans that graduated from forest school for their final rehabilitation phase and moved to an enclosure free, forested island
- Throughout 2023, 33 orangutans were successfully released into the wild. Amongst these individuals, 18 orangutans were reintroduced into TNBBBR, 8 into Batikap, and 9 into Kehje Sewen
- Ongoing patrols for the continued protection of BOS Foundation's forest release sites which are home to hundreds of reintroduced orangutans.
- 533 total orangutans reintroduced back into their natural habitats since 2012
- 7 new orangutan births were recorded from prior released female orangutans
- Worked with communities around our protected forests to support orangutan and habitat conservation

A total of 1785 donors are a part of our UK orangutan community. Of these **471** were new donors who we welcomed in 2023!

**263 ADOPTERS

Our wonderful Orangutan Allies community grew to over **213** strong, and we now have adopters around the world supporting our orangutans on their journey to freedom.

At BOS UK we have:

- Helped over 1300 people live a more sustainable and ethical life through our new palmoilpledge.com and wildlifetradepledge.com.
- Funded the planting of more than 400 trees in the Samboja Lestari Rescue Centre through our donors to create homes for the biodiversity of Borneo and reached out to communities to support orangutan and habitat conservation.
- Supported patrols and continued to protect forest release sites which are home to hundreds of reintroduced orangutans.
- Kicked off our latest project in June and later in the year funded the building of two islands in the new Nyaru Menteng location that supports the healthy lives of unreleasable orangutans
- Tripled donations for our Sanctuary Islands campaign from 18th-20th August in honour of International Orangutan Day
- Fully funded the 2023 Camera Trap campaign to further BOS Foundation's rainforest fauna health research efforts.
- Continued the work to reforest 40 Hectares (~100 acres) of peat swamp forest in Mawas, Central Kalimantan through our generous supporters



Outreach

We welcomed over **500 people** to our London film screening of the ground-breaking documentary film 'Eyes of the Orangutan'.

At London Vegfest 2023 we reached ~900 people with many trying out our VR headsets to visit Borneo's rainforests in London.

We continued hosting our Rainforest Yoga Retreat at Samboja Lodge in the heart of our Samboja Lestari Rescue Centre.

Global collaboration across BOS partners



From 7-10 August 2023, the global BOS Fundraising and Communication Partner Network gathered for a 4-day meeting in Wokingham, United Kingdom. The session provided a platform for open sharing of progress, knowledge exchange on fundraising strategies in various markets, and collaborative problem-solving for challenges faced in the previous year. Together, partners strategised for the upcoming year, fostering a sense of unity and shared purpose.



Education & Young Orangutan Warriors



- We held talks across the UK to nearly 300 people, educating them on the issues facing wildlife, our mission, and our work.

- Our Young Orangutan Warrior programme for taking action offers opportunities to speak with classes or community groups of any age with virtual presentations, in-person class/group discussions and education collaborations in support of rainforest and orangutan conservation.
- When attending one of our events, Young Orangutan Warrior Edward adopted Kopral after learning that Kopral has no arms and resides on a sanctuary island. His kind adoption has helped us in ensuring Kopral continues to live in a safe, rainforest environment.






